


THEICONIC FORD FALL-GON AS GT

Stage 77: Front Left Seat

The rear of the seat back is attached to the assembly from the previous issue, and the seat back is fixed to the seat base.




List of parts:

77A Left seat back rear panel

77B Left seat back foam

PS05 Seven* 2.3 x 4mm PB screws

* Including spare PB = Pan head for plastic



Stage 77: Front Left Seat



STEP 1

Fit the foam **77B** into the seat back assembly from the previous issue. Note the shape of the foam: the angled shape at the top fits into a recess in the seat cover.





STEP 3

Take the seat base assembly from issue 75 and fit the seat back between the two flanges on the seat frame **75A**.



STEP 4

Check that the screw hole in the flange on the seat base frame **75A** is aligned with the screw hole in the tab at the base of the seat back frame **76B**.



STEP 5

Fix in place with a **PS05** screw.

Stage 77: Front Left Seat



STEP 6

Turn to the other side of the seat and check that the screw hole in the flange on part **75A** is aligned with the screw hole at the base of the seat back frame. Fix in place with a **PS05** screw.

STEP 7

Take the floor assembly from issue 74 and the driver's seat from issue 15. Fit the driver's seat in place behind the steering wheel.

STEP 8

Turn the assembly over so that you can fix the seat in place with two **PSO5** screws, inserted from beneath the floor panel **69A**.



STEP 9

Similarly, fit the passenger seat in place on the other side of the central console.



STEP 10

Fix the passenger seat in place with two **PSO5** screws.
